

**Recreation Commission meeting # 11

**APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES:**

The minutes for January were approved with a motion from Mark seconded by Nicole.

**PUBLIC FORUM/CORRESPONDENCE:**

Mike from Zuper Bounce LLC attended the meeting to discuss an inflatable movie system he is looking to purchase. He has gone to his customers as well as various recreation departments to get a feel for the interest level of this type of venture. He said everyone he has spoken to has shown great interest in this. The inflatable movie screen offers a 16' x9' screen with a high quality picture and high quality sound system. The regular price would be \$1,249 for one show with an introductory 1<sup>st</sup> year price of \$999 per show. The price would cover the rental of the screen and sound system. Not included in the price is the Movie Licensing of \$250 - \$300 per movie for a one time showing. The movie would have to be offered as a free event to the community but we could fund it by obtaining sponsorships, advertising for before and after the movie and community fundraising such as dinner, popcorn etc. Mike gave the commission some ideas regarding sponsorship opportunities for the community. The commission has the information to look at and we will take a closer look to the details to see if this is something we would want to pursue.

**SENIOR COORDINATOR REPORT:**

Katrina reported that there were 11 members at the Executive Meeting this morning and 76 members at the January meeting. Katrina said he is a computer wiz and has offered to help with the newsletter. Congratulations to Martha Golterman who is Senior of the Month. The youth will be participating in an intergenerational bowling event with the seniors in March and they will also be helping out at the Snow Day next month as well.

**TOWN BOARD LIAISON COMMUNICATIONS:**

None from George. Stan reported that there was no vote for the review of Resolution #200 from October 11, 2004 Hamlin Lions Club to construct a permanent concession stand and restroom on Recreation Fields. The Town board did approve a free event with the Snow Fliers Snowmobile Club. This event will be a one time event to offer free rides in the park March 4<sup>th</sup> from 12-4PM. There will be two snowmobiles allowed to run at a time. Stan also reported that they have requested a moratorium for the wind towers, which will be put up for public hearing at the next meeting. This will allow us some control over anyone coming in wanting to put up a tower.

**DIRECTOR'S REPORT:**

Pat reported that the computers are up and running and she is waiting for Angel to install the programs on hers and Patty Jo's computer and then get them networked. Pat handed out the monthly program report for January showing the number of participants, start date, fees collected and expenses paid for each program running in January. Pat is interviewing 4 candidates for the Program Assistant position. Right now she needs someone to run the floor hockey program and the Start Smart program for the summer. Pat is looking into new photography options for the summer sports due to some problems we had last year with Color Graphics. She is hoping to have a decision with in the next couple of weeks.

**ASSISTANT DIRECTOR'S REPORT:**

Patty Jo reported that the whole staff will be at the Snow Day. This year we are lacking indoor entertainment for the Snow Day. Their hopes were to have the Drama program perform but that has been canceled. They are looking into some options. The Kick Wall art contest will be in the next brochure and the commission will be voting on the two best pictures at the May meting. We will have to get some donations for the winners of the contest possibly from Hamlin Sports. The soccer referees have to go to a three day 12 hour clinic which is \$65 plus the cost of the uniform. Patty Jo brought up the idea of some kind of reimbursement or incentive for the younger referees because it is rather costly for a 16 year old referee. The board unanimously approved a \$25 reimbursement for the cost of the class as long as they come back and officiate at least 2 Home games. Patty Jo reported that there will be something every night of the week for adults: Weight Watchers, ballroom dancing, aerobics etc. Patty Jo is trying to plan a kite making event for Spring Break. The playground program will be advertised in the next brochure. There will be an increase of price but the hours will also be extended.

**COMMISSIONER'S REPORT:**

Nicole reported that the Help Hamlin Playground raised \$487 from the Spaghetti Dinner this past

Saturday. St John's was generous enough to donate the gym and kitchen for no cost and the ladies who helped out from the church were a great help. Wegmans's donated a \$50 gift card, which covered the pasta, sauce and dressing. Tops donated the bread and parmesan cheese, Wendy's donated the drink and cups, Subway donated 2 cookie trays, Ryan's donated the salad mix and Pizza Shack donated the butter. There has been great community support for the Help Hamlin Kids.

Stan reported that our regular insurance will cover the skate park as per Denny's e-mail regarding the insurance. We just need to make sure that all regulations and rules are followed.

Pat had a FYI that March 10<sup>th</sup> is our Summer Sign up and volunteers are needed. The Babe Ruth tryouts were last night and there was a great turnout.
