

Town Board Meeting
September 10, 2007

The regularly scheduled Town Board Meeting was held in the Hamlin Town Hall located at 1658 Lake Rd., Hamlin, New York 14464. The meeting was called to order at 7 pm by Supervisor Dennis Roach. Everyone present participated in the Pledge of Allegiance and a Moment of Silence for all deceased residents of Hamlin.

PUBLIC FORUM

Supervisor Roach opened the public forum at 7:05 pm.

Linda DeRue of 317 Redman Rd. requested the Town Board minutes of August 13th be corrected to reflect a question asked during the reading of a statement by Supervisor Roach "Are you harassing me?" She then read the following statement.

"This is in response to Supervisor Roach's on the record, tirade at the last Town Board Meeting. His comments were not only malicious, but also should not have been made in this forum. Since he has decided that politically based commentary is acceptable at Town Board meetings, I will assume that this body can be used by all for this same purpose in the future.

As to Supervisor Roach's criticism about using the W.T.C. as a launch pad for political careers, this is totally untrue. It can perhaps be stated best, by putting this in its most basic form. Had Supervisor Roach not tried to control the W.T.C. and pursue his own agenda with the Town Board, and had Supervisor Roach chosen not to use the many deceitful tactics he has employed in his pursuit of his goal, then Mr. Supervisor, neither of the 2 W.T.C. members, who are now candidates for office, would have chosen to run. Speaking for Mr. Borkholder and myself, had you Mr. Supervisor, conducted yourself in a more honorable way, you would not now be facing opposition in the political arena.

I see no deceit to the public in any of my actions; however, the same cannot be said for yours. You have taken every opportunity to derail the good work of the W.T.C. You have remained inflexible on the termination of the committee's work, you say the right thing in public to defend your actions and then do things that are in total contradiction to what has been said. If anyone has cornered the market on deceit Mr. Supervisor, it is you.

The Candidates are running on the same political principles you professed to hold when running for office yourself. Yet honesty and open government seem to have been lost somewhere along the way.

When you, Mr. Supervisor, said you welcome an open election, so do we and in that spirit I would like to take this opportunity to suggest a series of debates where all issues can be addressed and individual positions can become clearly defined.

Regarding your last point about being clear on where we stand the answer is, we stand for The People of Hamlin, and the Town of Hamlin in that order. Our position is that when you, or anyone else, tries to remove power from the people, someone must stand up against injustice. We must let the voice of the people, all the people be heard. This must be so with every issue facing the town whether it be wind turbines or community centers or an other issues that involves all the residents of Hamlin."

Councilperson Rath asked if he could comment and stated that he had sat at the informal WTC meeting and it was asked in the public forum by Paul Lapinski if any of committee were candidates and Jerry Borkholder stated he was and Linda, you did not comment. Were you not a candidate at that point? It was open forum and you did not answer. Linda DeRue stated her signatures had not been verified yet.

Dave Lukas of 1288 Moscow Rd. commented on the meeting of August 28th in which Mr. McFarland attempted to define defensible and confused it with average. Also he neglected to include the Town of Malone. Also he forgot Cherry Valley setbacks, same issue in question. Mr. Lukas then asked each Town Board member what is defensible? Each member present referred to the Town Attorney. Also Mr. McFarland's statement on non-issues of shadow flicker and ice throws. Mr. Lukas read from the agreement of the Wind Turbine Company who has a contract.

Kathy Habgood of 142 Cook Rd. commented on two flaws in Mr. McFarland's statement on the bird issues. She takes issue also with the word flyway and read a definition. In correspondence sent to the town from experts it states there is a large concentration in our area. It is a natural corridor. Comments were also made on the bat issue. Finally, she read testimony from Donald Fry. She concluded with we have to have studies done on the bird issue.

Kim Spellan of 382 Morton Rd. stated she has had recently received some disturbing information that has come to her and would like the board members to comment. "Will either you or any of your family members benefit by incentives from the wind turbines?" Supervisor Roach stated loudly, "absolutely not." Councilperson Todd stated he would answer that too, but I'd like to ask you a question? Where did you get this information you're accusing someone of? Mrs. Spellan stated I am not accusing you of anything. Councilperson Todd replied that you lead off with a statement of some disturbing information. Where is your source? She replied my Attorney has advised me at this time not to make that information public. Councilperson Marchetti answered no. Councilperson Rose asked for the question to be repeated and then answered no. Councilperson Rath answered that he had an option on some of his land.

Art McFarland of Redman Rd. asked about the information being provided to Attorney Spitzer who is drafting the regulations. Supervisor Roach answered that the WTC recommendations have been provided. The minority and consensus report is public knowledge and on our web site. Our town and zoning codes as they reflect noise have been given to him for background information. I have not met with him to discuss any specific regulations.

Renee Cliff of 730 Redman Rd. asked for a follow-up to Mr. McFarland's question. Has a target date been given to Attorney Spitzer. Supervisor Roach stated he knows our general concern with Article X and we hope to have a draft by October and schedule a public hearing in November and hope to have regulations in place by the end of the year.

John DeRue of 317 Redman Rd. read from Mr. McFarland's report of August 28th in which he stated "Town Supervisor and Town Board have been subjected to a continuous barrage of insults, threats and coercion by anti-wind farm individuals." Mr. DeRue was told he is out of order as he directed comments directly at Mr. McFarland. Supervisor Roach reminded Mr. DeRue that the purpose of the public forum is for comments and questions to the Town Board and not dialogue and attacks on our residents. Supervisor Roach asked that he take that somewhere else. Supervisor Roach asked Mr. DeRue, "Do

you have a question or comment for the board?" Mr. DeRue stated he had met with Mr. McFarland at his residence and he relayed a call he made to you Mr. Supervisor that you better do something before Article X and the State comes in like storm troopers and tells you where the wind towers are going to go. Did he call you on this? Supervisor Roach stated he had talked with Mr. McFarland about Article X but I don't recall the date. Mr. DeRue asked did this conversation take place two weeks before you tried to disband the WTC. My conversation took place at about the same time that I heard from other Town Supervisors that Article X was going to be an issue.

Dorothy Lapinski of Redman Road asked Councilperson Todd about the question asked at the last WTC meeting on technology on noise for wind turbines with Skip Brennan mentioning dumping some wind was a solution. You stated you got your answer, please explain what was the answer. Councilperson Todd stated if you are going to quote me, please quote me correctly. My question to the committee was "are there other options out there other than setbacks?" I got my answer that other than setback there is technology to control noise. Mrs. Lapinski asked if you have done some research on this. He stated he had and then asked Mrs. Lapinski are there other options out there? Councilperson Todd raised the question for discussion that there are other options being discussed across the United States.

Pat Dorney of Morton Rd. stated at the last meeting I stated my husband and I are just getting into the wind turbines. She has visited a farm that is being developed and the cost of that project was 3 million. By the number of industrial turbines being proposed in Hamlin that would be a 150 million dollar project. Supervisor Roach stated, at this time there is no such plan for Hamlin. She asked the board to consider reinstating the WTC so they may continue their work and to extend the moratorium. She also asked the board to better inform the residents of Hamlin on this issue. Supervisor Roach stated that the moratorium is in effect and could be considered for extension. Mrs. Dorney felt the Town of Hamlin was not giving her information.

Jerry Borkholder of 391 Morton Rd. stated when the WTC was first scheduled we had a motion to send a letter to each household. What they did with that information was up to them. Eighty-seven days later after that motion was made a small notice appeared on page 15 of a 16 page document in the town newsletter. Mr. Borkholder felt it should have been on the first page.

Paul Lapinski of 417 Redman Rd. mentioned other towns that have wind turbines and the fact they had taken the time to listen to residents. Personally he doesn't think the WTC restrictions were strict enough.

David Lukas felt that the majority of the audience is concerned for the lack of information and no directive from the town since he himself provided, as a committee member, a ton of information. Councilperson Rath asked what would be best to hand out to the public not only for this issue but others? Pat Dorney stated the Town Board has a lot of resources and you can hire a publicity person. Andy Simpson of Moscow Rd.

stated a letter from the Town to every household. Inform the residents on where we are in the process.

Tricia Nesbitt of 52 Cook Rd. mentioned Mr. McFarland's letter and NIMBY and suggested a new meaning for that. What steps are you taking to protect the residents? Supervisor Roach stated we are drafting regulations that will be discussed later on. Troy Nesbitt mentioned some information coming from the Town of Alabama.

Linda DeRue mentioned a letter going out and the most cost effective way of sending it. Supervisor Roach stated, as we discussed I felt it was most cost effective at the time to put your letter in the newsletter. Paul Lapinski asked about the WTC recommendations and which report does the Supervisor feel is their recommendations? Supervisor Roach responded Consensus report. Mr. Lapinski asked that the August 28, 2007 Special Town Board Meeting minutes not be approved tonight as they have not appeared on the website as the public has not had a chance to review them.

When asked by Pat Dorney if the town would have representation at the September 27th public information meeting at St. John's? Supervisor Roach stated that they have been asked to participate in the Hamlin Preservation Group information meeting and we are working on a speaker. Public forum was then closed at 7:55 pm.

DISCUSSION

- a. Partnership with Hamlin Lions to provide for public restrooms:
Supervisor Roach stated the question came up on our continued support. We talked about this back in February about a motion made in 2004 on this joint project to construct a permanent restroom. I have provided the board the background information and a break-out of expenses. The funding was explained and noted as a Community Development Block grant by the town and community and fund raising by the Lions. After completion of construction it will be turned over to the town. The Highway Dept. was successful in securing a grant for construction of the road entrance. In the 2008 Town Budget there is a request for

funding under both recreation and parks which will show the Town's support. Supervisor Roach wanted everyone to have the information. Joe Rodgers from the Hamlin Lions who was present thanked the board for their support.

- b. Ethics Board: In the last issue of Town Topics there was an article on Ethics Board. Supervisor Roach shared that information and the five recommendations. Attorney Licht and the Chair of that board concur to increase number of members and provide for advisory opinions. Attorney Licht is requested to draft the appropriate Local Law. Board members feel it should be followed through.
- c. Shoreline Residential Zoning Workshop: It is referred back to the Zoning Workshop for review of the Monroe County Department of Planning and Development comments. Councilperson Rose felt that by the end of October we can get one scheduled.
- d. Child Safety Zones: As a result of information from the Town meeting on sexual offenders and research by Attorney Licht, we have developed a proposed local law on Child Safety Zones. Supervisor Roach would like a review of it and requests a public hearing.

A public information meeting must be held to assess the two proposals. National Grid will provide a representative for that night.

- f. Out-of-District Water Fees: Supervisor Roach explained that currently we typically had an out-of-district charge of \$30.00 done by resolution. We have not established that since going to Monroe County Water. A resolution would be needed to continue to charge the fee for out-of-district users in a debt free water district.

At the meeting Board Member Judy Hazen asked about a referendum on wind towers and Attorney Welch gave the explanation of why the State doesn't allow referendums for that purpose.

- Road work is being done. Finished the Walker Fire District parking lot and paved the entrance to the Recreation Field. A set of gates has been ordered.
- Brick Schoolhouse Rd. surfacing and also North Ave in Greece for the County.
- State should be starting the stop lights on the East Fork
- Providing the Village of Hilton speed monitor for the residents on Route 18 where bad accident have occurred. Supervisor Roach stated that he talked to Mr. O' Buckley of State DOT and they are putting the information together for an information meeting with the Town and County.
- Two or three weeks ago a drunk driver hit the fence at the Highway Bldg.
- Approved a salt contract at \$4.50 a ton.

- Meeting with the Hamlin Fire Department on the waterline for the property at the end of King St.
- Complaints are down and no fire calls this month. October is Fire Education month.

- Applications for STAR rebates did not get out on the target date but did get out on the target month.
- Taking STAR applications for those who have not signed up.
- When asked for the deadline for information on property maintenance fees, she would like the information at the end of this month.

Councilperson Rath reported on the following:

- Walker Fire Dept. still has a drainage problem that Tom is working on.
- Walker Open House is September 15th.

- Supervisor Roach asked if Councilperson Rath had any information on the public hearings for the fire budgets. The public hearings have to be publicized on the Town's website.

Councilperson Rose reported on the following:

- Meeting with the Seniors tomorrow and Thursday with the Library Board.

Supervisor Roach reported on the following:

- Everyone has a budget schedule. Tomorrow night's meeting will be just for Board Members, Highway and Bookkeeping, not department heads. All meetings are anticipated to start at 6 pm.
