**HAMLIN RECREATION
FALL BROCHURE 2009**

It's been a busy summer around Town Hall's parks and playground thanks to a very active sports and recreation program and summer day camp hosted by the Hamlin Recreation Department. As the kids return to school, you will continue to see activity around Town Hall as the Highway Department starts work on two special projects. As the result of several successful grants submitted by Town Board and the Highway Superintendent, the Town was awarded over \$100,000 in Monroe County Community Block Development funding. These funds will be used to erect a handicap accessible recreation building with restrooms, donated by the Hamlin Lions, and to construct a handicap-only parking lot and improve the existing handicap access at the south entrance to Town Hall.

The recreation building, a joint project of the Town of Hamlin and the Hamlin Lions, is a 60' x 40' building, which will include handicap accessible restrooms, concession stands, recreation area and equipment storage space. Purchased by the Hamlin Lions, the building will be located at the terminus of the new park entrance off of Roosevelt Highway. The Highway Department will be doing much of the site preparation including foundation work, paving the driveway and parking lot, and utility and sewer hookups.

The second project, to improve the accessibility of Town Hall, will consist of three phases, all funded by grants. Phase I, to be done by Hamlin Highway, consists of constructing and paving a handicap-only parking lot at the south entrance. Phase II will consist of constructing a "switchback" on the current handicap ramp to connect it to the new parking lot and constructing a sidewalk to connect the new parking lot to the rear gymnasium entrance. Phase III will consist of installing new handicap accessible, automatic doors at the south entrance and widening the vestibule.



I owe a belated welcome to three new Town Hall employees, who have filled vacancies caused by retirements or resignations. Welcome Don Wells, Assessor; Lee Nettin, Building Inspector/Code Enforcement Officer/Fire Marshall; and, Mary Ann Knapp, Deputy Town Clerk. Lee and Mary Ann are both long-time Hamlin residents. Don, who is also the assessor for the Town of Parma and Village of Hilton, lives in Parma. We are pleased to have all three onboard. They stand ready to serve you.

I want to put a plug in for our Hamlin Youth Group, which is volunteering for the USA WEEKEND "Make a Difference Day" on Saturday, October 24. Coordinated by Hamlin Recreation Staff Assistant, Nicole Sercu, the youth group will be assisting the Hilton Rotary in restocking the local food shelves. They will be joining many other youth volunteers from Hilton Schools in their efforts. It's Nicole's goal that the Town of Hamlin sponsor its own event in 2010. For more information or to participate, contact Hamlin Recreation at 964-7222. Hilton School students will be provided more information upon return to school.

Finally, as we enter the fall season, the time of harvest, it's a good opportunity to pause and reflect on the labors of our busy summer activities as well as those of our Hamlin farmers. I invite you to visit the Hamlin Farmers' Market, Sundays 9 am-1 pm (through October) at the Town Hall parking lot or stop by any of the road side stands to take advantage of the wonderful local crops.

News From the Dog Control Office

Per New York State Law, all dogs reaching four (4) months of age must be licensed. A Rabies Vaccination Certificate is required from a licensed veterinarian and must be presented to the Hamlin Town Clerk in order to obtain a dog license.

Anyone having more than three (3) dogs must have a Harboring Permit, which can be obtained from the Town Clerk for a one-time twenty five dollar (\$25) fee.

There is a LEASH LAW in the Town of Hamlin. All dogs not on the owner's property or on another person's property without permission are in violation of the Leash Law. Any dog that is picked up by Dog Control that is not wearing a license tag is presumed to be unlicensed. A twenty five dollar (\$25) fee is charged to the owner for the first violation. Fees for subsequent violations increase progressively--\$45 for the second, \$65 for the third, \$75 for the fourth, and \$100 for the fifth in a one-year period. Violations are assessed by occurrence of the same owner, not necessarily the same dog. An unlicensed dog cannot be returned to its owner until it is licensed.

Any dog picked up by Dog Control that does not have a current rabies vaccination cannot be returned to the owner per New York State Law. A twenty five dollar (\$25) violation fee is issued to the owner for transportation to the veterinarian. The dog owner is also responsible for any fees incurred at the veterinarian office. The owner must then license the dog at the Town Clerk's office prior to taking possession of the dog.

TOWN OF HAMLIN RESIDENTS
FALL CLEAN UP

Town Residents will be allowed to bring their own items to 4180 Brick Schoolhouse Road (Transfer Station) beginning Saturday, October 3rd through Sunday, October 11th 2009. Weekday hours are from 10 am - 7 pm and Weekend hours are 8 am - 4 pm. There will also be dumpsters available for recycling at our fall cleanup. You will need to separate the paper, glass, and metal and put in the appropriate dumpster.

The Town of Hamlin will **NOT ACCEPT** any garbage, stones, concrete, paint cans, or hazardous waste items.

Any items containing a gas tank must have the gas tank removed before we will accept it.
All gas tanks or drums must be clean, empty, and cut in half before we will accept them.

This year we will be collecting “e-waste” which will be recycled by SunnKing in Brockport. Below is a list of the items we will collect. The only items we will charge for are TVs and CRT monitors.

Although it may be hard to understand the needs of many of our own friends and neighbors in the community, with rising prices, layoffs, injuries and health issues, this is a continuing problem. Since Life Solutions has been incorporated, we not only meet their immediate needs of food, but are also able to counsel and refer them to other service providers.

As always, this year Life Solutions Food Pantry will be distributing Thanksgiving and Christmas baskets and gifts to those needing some extra help during these particularly difficult times. Last season, we gave out about 120 boxes of food for area families. This year, Thanksgiving distribution will be at the Methodist Church on Saturday, November 21st and Christmas distribution with food and gifts will be at the Firemen's Exempt on Saturday, December 19th.

I would like to introduce myself as the new Building Inspector/Code Enforcement Officer/Fire Marshal for the Town of Hamlin. I know many of you, as I have lived in Hamlin all my life and have worked for twenty years in the remodeling and homebuilding industry. For the last 16 years, I have owned and operated my own business as a remodeler and, more recently, a licensed home inspector. Prior to becoming the Building Inspector, I served on the Planning Board for Hamlin. It has always been, and continues to be, a genuine pleasure and privilege to serve our community.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone that most building projects in the Town require obtaining a permit before work can begin. 'Building' can include such changes as adding a room to your home, installing a pool, deck, or shed, or tearing off your roof. Failure to obtain the proper permit prior to commencing work is subject to a \$125 fine.

As the fall season approaches, you will want to begin thinking about cleaning out your chimney and furnace. Also, keep in mind that a permit is required for installation of a new fireplace or heating stove, whether wood-burning, pellet, or gas.

If you are not sure if a permit is required for your next home improvement project, please call our office at 964-8181 or stop in to see us. Our office hours are Monday, 8:30-noon and Tuesday through Friday, 8:30-noon and 12:30 -2:30.

I would like the residents of Hamlin to be aware that I have revoked the Peddler Permit for Ryan Nechita of Southwestern Company because of complaints received from residents. The Town has regulations regarding peddlers. A permit is required for soliciting, with the exception of politicians, non-profit organizations and students of local schools. Residents have the right to ask a peddler to see his permit as they are required to carry it at all times. Please feel free to call the office if you have any questions.



OUTDOOR FURNACES

Effective August 2009 all outdoor furnaces require a Building Permit. The cost of the permit is \$35.00. According to regulations, only firewood and untreated lumber are permitted to be burned. Outdoor furnaces are not permitted in R-H or Senior zoned districts. Lot size required is a minimum of 2 acres. The furnace must be a minimum of 20' from a building and a minimum of 50' from the nearest lot line. All outdoor furnaces must be equipped with a properly functioning spark arrestor. Failure to comply with any of these provisions is punishable by a \$200.00 fine.

Existing outdoor furnaces must obtain a Building Permit, which will be issued at no cost, if obtained prior to August 18, 2010. Failure to obtain a Building Permit and inspection within one year is subject to a \$125.00 fee.

Well, it's that time of year again, backyard BBQ's are coming to an end, school is starting up, our landscape changes colors, the smell of apples and pumpkins are just around the corner, and what most of us like least of all Tax Bills are due! Leave it to an Assessor to remind everyone that this time of year is tax season!

As the new Assessor for the Town Of Hamlin, I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself. My name is Don Wells and I have been the Assessor for the Town of Parma since 2002. I have lived in the Village of Hilton for over 20 years, am happily married to my wife Sandy, and have two daughters, Jennifer and Stacy. Both daughters are beyond their college years. Jennifer is happily married and works in Binghamton at Lockheed Martin. Jennifer and my son-in-law Kyle are expecting their first child this November and I'm anxiously looking forward to being a grandfather! Stacy works in Miami at the Jackson Memorial Hospital. As a typical dad, I am always worried about her being so far away and am always wishing she would move closer to home. I must admit though it has been very nice visiting her in Miami when we have had the opportunity to go visit her!

Since the merger of the Assessing Departments for both Hamlin and Parma, my summer has been quite busy going between towns. I have tried to familiarize myself with Hamlin as fast as possible, but must admit it will take more time! One fact many people may not know is that Hamlin and Parma are the second and third largest towns (square miles) in Monroe County. So as the Assessor I do have a lot of area to cover.

As most, if not all of the residents of the Town of Hamlin are aware, the Town is going through an Assessment Revaluation for the 2010 Tax Roll. GAR Associates have completed their data collection and have recently sent out an informational letter to inform the residents what to expect for the remainder of the year. As the Assessor for the Town, I am hoping to have the "new" assessment notices out to everyone in late February 2010. This will leave plenty of time for residents to review their "new" assessments if they feel it's needed.

Exemption renewal time is also upon us. Applications for all exemptions must be filed with the Assessor's office by March 1st, 2010 to receive credit for the 2010 tax year. Our office will be mailing out the Enhanced STAR renewal applications in October and they may be renewed by mail or in person with a copy of your 2008 tax return. If you receive the Low Income/Senior Citizen exemption, we will be mailing out the renewal applications the last week of December. They also may be renewed by mail or in person with a copy of your 2009 tax return or income statements. Residents who have the Basic STAR exemption do not need to reapply unless you have moved.

Any resident who may be turning 65 years of age anytime during the year 2010, please stop into the Assessor's office or call us at (964-8748) before March 1st, 2010 so we can evaluate your exemptions and possibly upgrade them.

I invite any resident into our office when they feel they are unfairly assessed. The opportunity gives both me and you, the homeowner, the chance to review the property inventory and the condition of the property and make adjustments if necessary. Our regular office hours are 8 am - 4 pm, Monday through Friday, but "assessment review" meetings may be scheduled anytime Monday through Saturday.

If you're interested in purchasing a property in the Town of Hamlin, please call the Assessor's office (964-8748) for information such as: current assessment, estimated taxes, property description, prior sales information, and any filed grievances about the property.

The Assessor's office is always willing to help current and new residents to the Town of Hamlin with any questions they may have. As residents continue to invest in properties within the Town of Hamlin, my goal as the Assessor is to make sure each resident understands their property assessment and feel they are being assessed fairly.

HAWLEY: CALLING ON HIS COLLEAGUES TO RETURN TO ALBANY



This year our state faced some unprecedented challenges and changes. Coupled with the financial meltdown on Wall Street and resulting recession, New Yorkers, especially in Western New York, are particularly feeling the burn of these tough times. However, despite this, many of my colleagues have gone on "summer vacation" and left the people of our state. It is time for lawmakers to get serious and return to Albany.

Given our economy and the tough times we have ahead, thanks to a record-breaking state budget, spending increases and tax hikes, I have tried very hard this summer to address the specific needs of our rural communities and stay positive by hosting free, fun and informative programs, using existing state resources, such as a boating safety course. This event was a success and I would like to thank the Monroe County Sheriff's Office and New York State Department of Parks and Recreation for their assistance.

Another gratifying event is my second annual Patriot Trip, which takes veterans from our area to Washington, D.C. to tour our nation's capitol and see the World War II, Korean, Vietnam and Iwo Jima monuments, Lincoln Memorial, and Arlington National Cemetery. Last year's trip was one of the most special and touching experiences of my life and I am thrilled that Congressman Lee has partnered with me to make this year's trip even better.

But this summer has not been all fun: we are in serious times and there is serious business to undertake. In response to the tornado which tore through communities like Corfu, I brought the Governor to witness the damage so that, working together, we could call on the federal government to provide immediate emergency aid.

While I am thrilled to have the Governor's partnership on this issue, I have taken a stand against some other proposals that he supports, which will hurt our Western New York region. For example, the Governor signed into law a 2 percent tax on all utility bills of residents and businesses in our state. I know that many families and especially seniors are struggling to pay their utility bills already. That's why I took the bull by the horns and drafted legislation that will repeal this ridiculous tax hike.

I also disagree with the Governor's choice to hand out \$200 cash, without any strings or controls attached to ensure that children are the ones benefiting from the money, per child to every parent on welfare for "school supplies," while our hard-working families are struggling to pay for their basic needs. I had encouraged the Governor to use \$1 billion of the stimulus dollars to reinstate the property tax rebate checks - after all, welfare benefits were already increased by 10 percent. Our farmers, especially dairy farmers, are on the brink of closure due to Albany's inaction. Something is wrong with this system and that's why I am calling on my colleagues to immediately return to Albany. We can't afford to wait any longer...we must return to Albany to finish the people's business.


