



This year Property Exemptions will be sent out approximately the same time as School Tax bills go out. The last day to return the Exemption is still March 1, 2017, but you may do so at any time before that date.

You will receive a Golden/Yellow colored Exemption form for those renewing the Enhanced STAR.

You will receive a Blue colored Exemption form for those renewing the Low Income Senior or Disability Exemption.

You will receive a Green colored Exemption form for those renewing the Agricultural Exemption.

All other exemptions will be done on White paper.

HISTORIAN'S CORNER



In the Beginning As you traverse the roads and by-ways of the present day town of Hamlin it might be hard to imagine that 200 years ago it was densely wooded and swampy. It was not the agrarian landscape you see today. It was reported that it was so densely wooded that sunlight could not penetrate the trees and undergrowth to get to the soil. Wildlife such as deer, bear, and wolves among other creatures were in ample supply. There was no shortage of mosquitoes. As the settlers moved in and deforested and drained the land, desirable and fertile farms were created. Most of us could not begin to imagine or appreciate the hardships the early settlers endured to sustain a living and to create a life for their families out of the wilderness. They referred to it as "The black north." Today we are still enjoying the fruits of their labors.

In those days the area which would become the town of Hamlin was part of what was called the Triangular Tract. It was a triangular shaped parcel of land which stretched from the present day towns of Leroy and Pavilion to Lake Ontario including what we now recognize as the town of Hamlin. It was originally deeded to Robert Morris, a financier of the American Revolution, on May 11th, 1791. It was eventually sold to Herman Leroy, William Bayard, James McEvers and Matthew Clarkson on January 11th, 1793, subject to the Indian's claim, which was resolved at the Treaty of Big Tree in 1797.

In the early 1800 's Triangle Road (now knows as Lake Road) was surveyed and developed to allow somewhat easier access to the remote regions of the tract including the town of Hamlin, which was the last to be developed due to its remoteness and the ruggedness of it's landscape. Other north-south roads were also planned and eventually developed.

Many of the first settlers to this area came from Eastern New York, New England, and Oneida County, who heard of the fertile lands of the Genesee Country. They purchased their land parcels at the Land Office in Leroy, NY. A couple of the stipulations were that they needed to construct an 18 foot square dwelling within three months and live on the land for at least three years. Primitive log cabins were prevalent dwellings at the time due to the abundance of trees. James McCasson purchased the first lot in 1804 followed by other settlers. It was not until after the hostilities associated with the war of 1812 concluded in 1815 did settlement of this area begin in earnest.
