



Message from the Supervisor

I was distressed to read the results of the recent study by the Greater Rochester Health Foundation, which found that over 45% of Hamlin's children and teens are overweight or obese as compared with 26 percent of the overall suburban children in Monroe County. This is certainly a distinction that we would prefer not to have. Based on my conversation with a representative of the Greater Rochester Health Foundation, they were also surprised by the findings. They reviewed our program of Town recreational activities and are impressed with the number and variety of activities and programs offered by Hamlin Recreation. However, having the greatest programs available is not benefiting anyone if they're not being used. I encourage parents to check out our youth activities and programs and take the steps necessary to enroll your children. If you don't have the time or money to enroll them, at least encourage a more active life-style for them. And don't be hesitant to set the example yourself! If you need advice on programs available, please call our Recreation Department, 964-7222.

Healthy lifestyles involve not only regular physical activity but also healthy eating. We are blessed to live in an area that provides a wide variety of locally grown, healthy food. A new local initiative, "Grow Monroe," was created to encourage consumers to buy locally grown agricultural products and to make information available for consumers interested in buying local products. As most everyone knows by now, a judge annulled our wind tower regulations because a "hard look" was not given to the relevant areas of environmental concern, even though we had identified them. The complete written decision can be found at <http://hamlinny.org/wind-tower.html>. The Town has reverted back to our original regulations on wind towers, which allows landowners to construct 50-foot towers with a building permit. Town Board remains generally supportive of wind towers and believes they will be beneficial to the Town, the economy and the environment. However, having already expended over \$15,000 of tax payers' money to enact and defend pertinent regulations, we will reserve further investments of money and effort until we can determine a course of action which puts us in the best legal position and from which the taxpayers of Hamlin can receive the optimal benefit.

In January, the combined Community Center/Senior Center/Library Concept and Feasibility Committee met for the last time for the foreseeable future. The Committee has been working with architectural and engineering consultants from Clark Patterson and Lee to develop a master plan and concept for a combined center which would accommodate the joint needs of our library, senior citizens and recreation department. The Committee has successfully produced a site plan, master plan, phase I plan and identified both capital and operational/maintenance costs. However, due to the current economic and fiscal crisis, the Committee recommended that the plan be "shelved" until such time as economic conditions improve or a capital reserve account is significantly augmented. I extend my appreciation to the dedicated members of the Committee: Peter Terry (Chair), Jim Doan, Mike Fabiano, Diane Hennekey, Nancy Jennejahn, Stan Lyons, Angel Male, Eileen Preston, Glen Quetschenbach, Don Rabjohn and Linda Rabjohn.

Building Inspector/Code Enforcement Office

The 'new' but old Building Inspector/Code Enforcement Officer and Fire Marshal is Charlie Hungerford. The new assistant Building Inspector/Code Enforcement Officer and Fire Marshal is Chuck Mosele. Charlie is full time and Chuck works part time. If you need their help, call 964-8181. They are both here to help you.

Attention Farmers: It's that time of the year again when brush is burned. Don't forget to call for a burn permit from the Fire Marshal. Please use good judgment when burning (wind and wind direction, etc). **BEFORE YOU BURN** please call 964-8181 or Charlie at 690-7493. Farmers that earn over 50% of their income from the farm are the only residents allowed to burn without a permit.

Lakeshore Residents: There are new regulations from the Federal and State Government that require 3 permits for any construction or building permit. One is the L.W.R.P. which is a state permit issued for the Lakeshore. This permit requires the Conservation Board to look at the project site and the Planning Board to approve it before a building permit is issued. The Conservation Board checks for consistency with our L.W.R.P. requirements. The second permit, required by the Federal Government, is the flood hazard permit. This permit requires input from the Homeowner, Building Inspector and a licensed surveyor. This permit costs \$25.00. The third permit is the Conservation Corridor Permit which may or may not be required depending on location of the project.

Also remember when working any project in the waters (such as docks) the DEC will also require a DEC permit and approval before the town permits.

Unregistered vehicles: The Town Code does not allow any junked, abandoned, or unregistered vehicles on a property in the Town of Hamlin. The exception is on farm vehicles used for the farming operation, or vehicles with attached snowplows that are used on that property for plowing snow. These vehicles should not be unsightly.

We are allowing cars to be covered with a car cover, not tarping, as long as it stays covered. We also allow cars to be put for sale as long as it has a visible sign from the road indicating it is for sale.

Residents can obtain an outside storage permit for a vehicle that is being parked out for 60 days only. Residents can obtain an outside storage permit for one year to restore an antique, classic or other car. These permits cost \$25.00 per year or 60 days whichever you need.

Woodstove and pellet stove owners:

Please keep your stoves and chimneys clean. Chimneys should be cleaned often. Weekly or monthly cleaning is important. If you let a chimney go more than a month during use, you are risking a chimney fire. Have the chimneys and stoves inspected annually. If you need to reline the chimney, replace the stove or get a new stove, the permit cost is \$35.00.

SPRING CLEAN-UP

This year we changed our spring cleanup from two weeks to one week. But we are adding another week in the fall. We did this at the request of some residents who thought it would be beneficial to have two cleanups instead of one each year.

Town Residents will be allowed to bring their own items to 4180 Brick Schoolhouse Road (Transfer Station) starting Saturday, April 25th through Sunday, May 3rd 2009. Weekday hours are from 10 am - 7 pm and weekend hours are 8 am - 4 pm.

There will also be dumpsters available for recycling at our spring cleanup. You will need to separate the paper, glass, and metal and put in the appropriate dumpster.

The Town of Hamlin will **NOT ACCEPT** any garbage, stones, concrete, paint cans, or hazardous waste items. On June 13th, Monroe County will be having a local Hazardous Waste pick-up, in the Town of Sweden. More information on registering for that day will be coming as we get closer to that date.

Any items containing a gas tank must have the gas tank removed before we will accept it. All gas tanks or drums must be clean, empty, and cut in half before we will accept them.

This year we will be collecting electronic waste which will be recycled by SunKing in Brockport. The Town Clerk's office has a full list of what will and will not be accepted. There are items that will be taken for a fee. They are as follows:

Items taken for a fee:

\$20.00 per item with Freon	\$10.00 per TV
\$ 2.50 per car tire	\$ 5.00 per CRT monitor

These items have to be paid for at the Town Clerk's Office before taking them to the Transfer Station. The Town Clerk's Office is open 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. We will accept cash, check, money order, Master Card, or Visa.

BRUSH PICK-UP

The Town of Hamlin will be doing the Spring Brush Pick-up starting **May 11th** through **May 15th**.

Brush has to be cut into lengths of 8 feet or less.

Please pile the brush parallel with the road.

Please **Do Not** include any type of lumber.

Please **Do Not** intertwine piles.

Brush has to be on the side of the road by **May 11th**.

The Town will **ONLY** make **ONE** pass down each road.

Only two 6-wheel truck loads per owner

News From the Dog Control Office

All dogs reaching 3 months of age must be licensed.

All dogs must have a rabies vaccination from a veterinarian and submit it at time of licensing. If the dog for some reason cannot be vaccinated, a letter from the veterinarian must be presented to the Hamlin Town Clerk stating the reason.

If you are found to harbor a dog not licensed, you will be issued a notice to license the dog requiring an additional fee of \$5.00 plus the license fee, or issued an appearance ticket for violation of Hamlin Dog Control Law or New York State Ag & Markets Law for unlicensed dog, or both. When a notice is issued, a reasonable timeframe is given for the dog owner to comply.

When the Hamlin Dog Control Officer picks up a dog at large a \$25.00 pick-up fee is applied to the owner of the dog.

The dog must be licensed prior to returning to the owner, and the rabies vaccine determined to be current.

If the rabies vaccine is not current, the dog must be vaccinated before it is returned to the owner.

The owner will be responsible for veterinarian fees plus a \$25 transport fee.

When a dog is found to be at large and does not have a license tag attached to the collar, the dog will be considered to be unlicensed and placed in the kennel until the owner is identified. Kennel fees will be assessed to the dog owner at \$10.00 per day until the dog is returned to the owner.

All efforts are made to reunite a lost dog with the owner. Report a missing or found dog as soon as possible. Hamlin dog control laws are available at the Hamlin Town Hall or visit www.hamlinny.org to read them on line.
