## NEWS FROM HAMLIN'S HISTORY CENTER

Since the town was established in 1852, the Town of Hamlin has been the County's second largest town in land area with 44.4 square miles (26,387 acres). Though our land boundary has never changed our population certainly did, particularly in the past 70 years.

Between 1852 and 1952, Hamlin's population remained fairly constant with approximately 2,200 residents. As roads and transportation improved, people were willing to live farther distances from their place of employment and the Town experienced a dramatic increase in population. In 1960, the census showed 2,755 people living within its borders; within thirty years (1990), we saw an increase of 6,448 people, with the census counting 9,203 individuals.

During the most recent decade the town's population growth started to decline for a variety of reasons. In the year 2000, our population increased by only 149 residents and by our last census in 2010, for the first time in 70 years, our population in Hamlin declined to a total of 9,045. This remains fairly consistent with the number that reside in our Town today.

Farming and farm-related businesses have continued to be the major economic activities within the Town, although currently many of the Town's residents are employed in and commute to nearby metropolitan employment centers.



### HAMLIN HEROES

For our Hamlin Residents on Active Duty with the U.S. Military, information and an 8x10 photo is displayed on our Hamlin Heroes wall in the Town Hall. Forms are available in the Town Clerk's office. Information is also used for a Resolution of Appreciation to be presented at a Hamlin Town Board Meeting upon return from duty.

Work is well underway to update our Town web site. We hope to have that on line by the middle of the summer. Some things are small but helpful, like a new set of racks on the wall between the Assessor’s office and the Building Inspectors office with most of the commonly asked for forms in stock so they are available any time the town hall is open.

Right from the start we went to work and have contracted to buy a parcel of land adjacent to the highway building and dog shelter to secure a place for them to operate and expand. It will also be a great place to possibly put a park, dog walking area, or an additional playground. There are many possibilities to look forward to. The new Library building is underway and we are eagerly awaiting its completion. It will be an extraordinary addition to our community.

I am looking forward to continuing to work for the betterment of the Town of Hamlin. I am here at the town hall Monday and Wednesday evenings and Saturday mornings regularly, and I find myself here a lot of other times as well. My door is always open; feel free to stop in and say hello. I enjoy speaking to everyone.

## HAMLIN DOG SHELTER

The Hamlin Dog Shelter serves as a benchmark program for NYS Ag & Markets, providing a model for other towns who have been calling to learn more about our operations and performance. They currently provide full service to the Town of Parma and assist the Town of Gates by taking all unwanted dogs who were going to be euthanized and putting them up for adoption. They average 10-15 dogs from the Town of Gates each year! There have been increasing levels of interest from other towns due to Hamlin's remarkable efforts. In 2013, the Hamlin Dog Shelter, together with the Town Clerk's office, effectively managed the licensure and rabies vaccination of over 1,880 dogs in the town.


### HAMLIN DOG SHELTER AND THE MIA FOUNDATION

The MIA Foundation is a national organization based here in Western NY; it was developed to give dogs born with birth defects a fighting chance, since many are euthanized instead of being given the necessary therapeutic interventions to live a normal life. The Hamlin Dog Shelter assists in the ongoing care of these dogs, many of whom are puppies, until the dogs go to their adoptive homes. To date, the dog shelter has had 3 MIA dogs – one with a cleft palate, one with swimmers syndrome, and one had 4 blood clots removed before reaching the shelter. 2 of the 3 had been placed in trash bags and left to die in dumpsters. Many kudos to the staff and volunteers at the shelter for their devotion to those most in need.



### SHELTER EXPANSION IN 2014

The Hamlin Dog Shelter has begun the process of expanding its facilities, to include the addition of 10 more kennels, creation of an adoption area, and a bathing center.



## HAMLIN HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

### **BRUSH PICKUP**

Spring cleaning is on everyone's mind, including ours at the Highway Department. We have tentatively scheduled the following dates for Brush Pickup:

**April 28-May 2, 2014**

**If the weather is uncooperative and too wet for the community to effectively prepare for pickup, the backup dates are May 12-May 16, 2014.**

**NOTE:** The brush must be cut into lengths of 8 feet or less and must be piled parallel with the road. Please **DO NOT** include any type of lumber and **DO NOT** intertwine piles. The brush must be on the side of the road by April 28<sup>th</sup>.

Items we will accept include microwaves, televisions, printers, computer mouse, AV equipment, circuit boards, keyboards, laboratory equipment, cell phones, pagers, fax machines, cables & wire, telephone equipment, typewriters, copiers, monitors (CRT) all sizes.

**Items taken for a fee:** \$2.50 per car tire; \$15.00 per item with Freon. **PLEASE NOTE** that the fees must be paid for at the Town Clerk's office **BEFORE** taking them to the Transfer station.

Any items containing a gas tank **MUST** have the gas tank removed before we will accept it. All gas tanks must be clean, empty, and cut in half before we will accept them.

The town of Hamlin **WILL NOT ACCEPT** garbage, stones, concrete, paint cans, or hazardous waste items.

SUMMER TRAVEL\*\*\*\*\*PASSPORT NEWS



As Spring begins to take hold, summer still seems far away but believe it or not people are already planning their summer vacations. You will need a passport if you plan to leave and/or return to the U.S. Regular processing can take 4-5 weeks; expedited processing can take 2-3 weeks. Passports issued to minors are valid for 5 years; adult passports are valid for 10 years. The Hamlin Town Clerk's Office can process your initial passport book/card application. If you need to renew your passport, you will need a new photo but otherwise you process the application yourself. The Hamlin Town Clerk's Office has the applications and can take your photograph. The fees are:

## **BUILDING INSPECTORS OFFICE**

It is that time of the year when the big-box stores start rubbing their hands together in eager anticipation of skyrocketing pressure treated lumber sales. Building a deck isn't too difficult, but it takes planning and knowledge of basic building techniques and the standards and requirements of the Residential Code of NY.

**1<sup>ST</sup>**, you need a plan with enough information so that anyone who reads it could build exactly what you envision. It doesn't need to be architect quality but it should include details like how the posts and beams are connected, the connections between the deck and the house (if it is connected) railing details, footing details, stair details, and lumber type and dimensions. My office has several excellent documents available for free that show different acceptable construction techniques for each of the components. If you would prefer electronic versions, we can attach them to an email for you.

**2<sup>ND</sup>**, don't limit your materials choice to what is offered at the big-box stores. Often, you can get better quality for the same or less money from local lumber companies- and most lumber companies deliver for free.

**3<sup>RD</sup>**, 42 inches deep for a footing is a deep hole. If you have more than a few columns or posts to set, I suggest you consider hiring someone with an auger to bore the holes for you. The time saved (and your back) is often a bargain compared to the price of the service. The footing size requirements are dependent on the deck size and soil types but plan on at least 144 square inches of footing for each column base.

**Finally**, plan to take as much time as you need instead of a set period of time. Things go slower than expected unless you are an experienced builder. Don't be afraid to call and ask questions; it's much easier to ask than to have to take something apart and do it over.

Good luck on all your building projects this spring! And, now that the snow is gone, please be a good neighbor and pick up everything that's been conveniently buried for the past months.



## **TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE**

- The Hamlin Town Clerk is the Tax Receiver and has been in the process of receiving/accounting for Town and County taxes that aren't collected by a bank holding a tax payers mortgage. The office will begin collecting School Taxes for the Brockport and Hilton School Districts during the following periods:

9/1/2014 - 10/1/2014	No Interest Due
10/2/2014 – 10/31/2014	Interest Due

- Most marriages occur in the Spring and Summer and the Hamlin Town Clerk's office issues marriage licenses. To apply for a marriage license, you and your partner must present proof of age (drivers license, birth certificate, baptismal record, or U.S. Passport may be used for this purpose). If either partner has been previously married, the divorce decree must be presented as well. Both partners complete the license and it is notarized by the Clerk's office. Once issued, there is a 24-hour waiting period and it will remain valid for 60 days. Certified copies of the license are available for a \$10 fee.
