By the time this article appears in print, exact census figures for Hamlin may be known, but as for now our best guess is a population count of 9,045 residents. The first article in the Rochester Democrat & Chronicle, after 2010 census numbers were made public, stated we had a reduction of about 3.5% in our population, coming down from the 2000 census figure of 9,355. Towns on the east side of the county, including Webster, Henrietta, and Pittsford, saw large increases in residents while the county overall had about a 1% increase.



I mention this because of who we are and what you, our residents, have told the town in surveys conducted in the past when your opinion was sought. Overwhelmingly the prevailing message was to keep Hamlin rural. By no means does this intend to discourage recent building in areas such as Hamlin Meadows or Country Creek. Areas of development such as these with municipal services available in the form of public water and sewers are encouraged and a benefit to the town. To cite two more, Hillcrest still has open lots to develop for homes, as does Apple Hollow. Both of those tracts are in the center of town and have the services in place to accommodate new housing.

The town's main industry is agriculture and this is where an emphasis continues to be on our efforts to retain our valuable farmland and remain a town characterized as rural. Over the past several years the Zoning Workshop Committee has been working on examining our current laws as they pertain to our rural development. What has evolved is an amendment to the Hamlin Zoning Law of 1991 tentatively entitled "Agricultural Protection Overlay District." This concept does not come "out of the blue," but is a part of the town's Comprehensive Master Plan. Borrowing from a preliminary draft of the proposed provision, it is noted among other things that the purpose of the Overlay District legislation would be "to preserve existing prime agricultural soils," "to minimize the conflicts between agricultural and nonagricultural uses," and "to discourage residential sprawl and attendant increased costs which otherwise would be required to provide municipal services." As noted above, this amendment has taken a long time to arrive at this point having been the subject of much thought and discussion. An informational meeting could be planned for our residents along with a required formal public hearing before adoption by the Town Board. I encourage everyone interested to be a part of this discussion at the appropriate time.

Project Announcement: Towns of Clarkson and Hamlin Route 18 Over Moorman Creek Bridge Replacement

Project Highlights:

- Existing structure originally built in 1932.
- The new bridge is to be a 3-sided concrete culvert type with an asphalt riding surface.
- Construction is tentatively planned for 5 months in 2012.

Description:

The New York State Department of Transportation is in the Preliminary Design Phase of replacing the bridge over Moorman Creek, on Route 18, (Clarkson Hamlin Town Line Road) just west of the intersection of Route 260 and Route 18, in the Towns of Clarkson and Hamlin in Monroe County.

Through our continuing efforts to keep our customers informed, we have prepared this notice for your information. We encourage you to call or email us with any questions or concerns. This project will replace the existing 78 year old Route 18 bridge over Moorman Creek. The expected lifetime of the new bridge is over 70 years.


The project is currently scheduled for construction to begin in 2012. We will send a project update in Spring 2012, prior to the actual start of construction.

Traffic Control:

Traffic will be detoured while the bridge is replaced. The official detour is along State Routes 260, 104 and 19. Other local roads will not be impacted by this project.

PAST AND PRESENT

As you enter the Town Hall from the north entrance, you will notice a large metal plaque on the east outside wall. It tells about Hamlin Center and five men who were the first to settle in the vicinity. Only one of the five stayed the rest of his life in the town we now know as Hamlin. That was John Nowlin.

John was born on March 23, 1763, in Dutchess County, New York. When he was approximately forty-five years old, he with his wife Dolly and seven children, moved to the general area where "Tops Friendly Markets" stands today. When in a time when people moved from place to place after several years, John, according to the census and road district records, always seemed to stay on the same property that he settled on.

According to Professor William McIntosh's, "History of Monroe County, New York, 1788-1877", two of John and Dolly's offspring produced a couple of Hamlin firsts. Michael, the eldest son, is said to have become Hamlin's first teacher. Teaching the children of the other first settlers, the Haskell's and the Randell's. Silas Nowlin born soon after their arrival was possibly the first birth in the town.

John passed away on September 19, 1852 at the age of eighty-nine. Both John and Dolly are buried in a small cemetery just a quarter of a mile north of the North Star History Center on the farm of his son-in-law, Stephen Baxter, Jr. He passed away not knowing that the land he worked and lived on for nearly forty-five years would become within a few short months the town of Union (Hamlin).

Stop by the Historian's Booth at the Wheel Fest on June 4th and say hello. We will be handing out brochures about our town's history, along with some items for sale that will be reduced in price just for that day.

Help us celebrate the 150th anniversary of the re-naming of our town as we salute Hamlin on Heritage Day, September 25th at the North Star History Center. ENJOY YOUR CAMP FIRE

A camp fire is a great way to enjoy an evening get together. Please be safe with your camp fire and keep it contained in a 4' fire ring made from non-combustible material, using only dry campfire wood. Every year the Fire Department is called out several times to investigate smokey or out of control camp fires. Be courteous of your neighbors, keep your fire under control and make sure the smoke is not interfering with their enjoyment. HOUSE NUMBERS

It is important that your building (house) numbers are visible from the street. Emergency responders, fire, ambulance and police depend on the house numbers to find the correct address. According to Hamlin Code, building numbers must be at least 5" high, sharp contrast to the background color, must be on the side of the building that faces the road and be visible from the center of the road. Please take a minute to check and make sure that your house numbers are visible from the road. This will help ensure a quick response in the case of an emergency. 

BUILDING PERMITS

A building permit is required in the Town of Hamlin for a shed, fence, pool, deck, addition, garage, pole barn, gazebo, pond, wood burning stove, emergency generator and sign, just to name a few. Re-roofing requires a permit when a tear-off occurs. A dumpster must be onsite before the work begins. The cost of a permit is \$10.00. Failure to obtain a building permit is subject to a \$125.00 fee plus the cost of the permit.

If you have any questions regarding a building permit or if you need to get a building permit, please contact the Building Department at 964-8181 Monday through Friday, 8:30 am - 2:30 pm. A complete list and costs can be found on our web page at www.hamlinny.org.

WORD ABOUT INSURANCE

When a building permit is issued, the Building Department is required by New York State to verify that your contractor has liability and Worker's Compensation insurance. If you are completing the work yourself and hire someone, it is up to you to verify that the company has the proper insurance to protect you from law suits.

LEAD - THE NEW DANGER

Lead is the new danger in our homes that has caught our attention in the last few year years. If your home was built before 1978, there could be lead in the paint. Any renovations or repairs could contaminate your home and contractors must be certified as a Lead-Safe Contractor. Please visit www.epa.gov/getleadsafe or call 1-800-424-LEAD for more information.

FUN IN THE SUN!!!

When the hot summer sun beats down, a swimming pool is very appealing. But because pools are also attractive and potentially dangerous to young children, New York State building codes require pools to be fenced and gated. If you are considering a swimming pool, hot tub or spa purchase, contact the Hamlin Building Department first to obtain a permit and determine what requirements you must follow. The cost of the permit is \$30.00 and a final inspection is required before the pool can be used. An electrical inspection will need to be done before the final inspection. Failure to obtain a permit will result in a \$125.00 fine plus the cost of the permit. In ground and above ground pools, including inflatable pools holding more than 24 inches of water, must be surrounded by a fence or other barrier at least 4' high. Any gates in the fence must be self-closing and self-latching with a lock. A water surface alarm is also required for new pools. These codes are in place for a reason. They are added safety measures to protect you, your neighbors and your guests from swimming pool accidents. As a pool owner, you are responsible for anyone in your pool.

A Message from the Stormwater Coalition of Monroe County

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT LAWN FERTILIZER

Stormwater runoff from yards in which fertilizers have been misapplied, by such practices as using too much or spreading onto sidewalks or driveways, will flow into storm drains that lead to neighborhood stormwater ponds and local creeks. The nutrients in the fertilizer will pollute this stormwater and will often contribute to unsightly algae blooms in local neighborhood stormwater ponds, frequently resulting in obnoxious odors when this algae dies off and decays. Eventually, this nutrient polluted water will make its way to Lake Ontario and contribute to the algae problems found at Ontario Beach.

Homeowners can take action to reduce these impacts and help protect water quality by ensuring that **ONLY ZERO PHOSPHORUS FERTIZLIZERS** are applied to their lawns, as well as **SWEEPING UP** fertilizer that ends up on impervious surfaces such as sidewalks and driveways. Most soils in Monroe County already have sufficient phosphorus to support a healthy lawn. Applying fertilizers only once a year in the fall, the most important time of the year to fertilize, will also greatly reduce the amount of nutrients reaching our local waterways.

Recognizing the serious impacts of fertilizers on water quality, New York State has recently passed a law which prohibits phosphorus in fertilizers for established lawns starting in 2012. This law also requires that fertilizer put on impervious surfaces be picked up. So get a jump start on these future legal requirements and start protecting our local waterbodies today!

DID YOU KNOW?

- * The storm drains located on your street or in your back yard lead directly to local creeks and ponds. Water, or any materials, entering these storm drains receive **NO TREATMENT**.
- * The label on the fertilizer bag shows three numbers which indicate the percentage by weight of nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium, in that order. So make sure you choose a fertilizer that has 0 phosphorus, for example 26-0-3.
