NYS Dog Licensing

New York State Law requires all dogs to be licensed and to have their license renewed each year.

Rabies Vaccination: Town of Hamlin requires all dogs 4 months of age and older to receive a primary vaccination against rabies (good for 1 year), and to receive re-vaccinations or booster vaccinations every three years for the life of the dog.

Keep the Cycle Going

Remember that Hamlin participates in recycling programs with the help of "IMAGINE IT...fundraising through recycling", and SUNNKING.

Small items can be brought to the Town Hall and deposited in the IMAGINE IT box during regular business hours. These include printer cartridges, cell phones, MP3s, and PDAs. Other portable electronics are also accepted here: laptops, digital cameras and camcorders, DVD players, GPS devices, satellite radios, USB memory keys, gaming devices, and external hard drives. Proceeds from recycling these items benefit the Friends of Hamlin Beach State Park.

Larger electronics such as TVs, monitors, keyboards, electronic mice, fax machines, scanners (less than 100 lbs.), printers and any permanently attached cables, cords or wiring can be brought to the Highway Garage at 91 Railroad Ave. from 7am - 3:00 pm, Monday through Thursday.

HAMLIN FIRE MARSHAL

A reminder from the Fire Marshal to keep your solid fuel burning appliance and chimney cleaned during the heating season.

- * Every building with a Carbon Monoxide (CO) source should by law have a carbon monoxide detector outside of each sleeping area. CO is produced by incomplete combustion of fossil fuels like natural or propane gas, wood, kerosene, pellets, coal or corn, etc. If you do not have a CO detector yet, for your own safety, install a detector before the heating season.
- * If you have a fire hydrant on your property, your assistance in keeping it clear of snow would be appreciated for easy access for the Fire Department in the event of a fire.
- * Please do not plow or shovel snow into the roads or sidewalks.
- * It is important that your building (house) numbers are visible from the street. Emergency responders, fire, ambulance and police depend on the house numbers to find the correct address. According to Hamlin Code, building numbers must be at least 5" high, sharp contrast to the background color, must be on the side of the building that faces the road and be visible from the center of the road. Please take a minute to check and make sure that your house numbers are visible from the road. This will help ensure a quick response in the case of an emergency. BUILDING PERMITS



A building permit is required in the Town of Hamlin for a shed, fence, pool, deck, addition, garage, pole barn, gazebo, pond, wood burning stove, emergency generator and sign. Just to name a few. Re-roofing requires a permit when a tear-off occurs. A dumpster must be on site before the work begins. The cost of a permit is \$10.00. Failure to obtain a Building Permit is subject to a \$125.00 fee plus the cost of the permit.




NYSDOT PLANS TO REPLACE BRIDGE OVER MOORMAN CREEK STARTING NEXT SPRING

The 78 year old Bridge over Moorman Creek, on Route 18, (Clarkson Hamlin Town Line Road) just west of the intersection of Route 260 and Route 18 will be replaced next year. The existing structure was originally built in 1932 and has reached the end of its useful life. It will be replaced by a 3-sided concrete culvert type with an asphalt riding surface.

Construction is tentatively planned for up to 5 months starting in late spring 2012. Traffic will be detoured while the bridge is replaced. The official detour is along State Routes 260, 104 and 19. Other local roads will not be impacted by this project.

From the Town Historian

PAST AND PRESENT

This past September, the History Center received a gift of four ledgers from Myrtle Eidman Chomyk of Auburn, New York. These ledgers contain the business expenses and receipts of her grandfather, John Eidman. They contain the entries from the years, 1887-1897, 1906-1909, 1910-1913 and 1916.

John Eidman lived on the east end of Walker Road. He was an enterprising farmer with business interest in neighboring properties. His last ledger seems to indicate that by 1916, he became a mechanic, working on automobiles and repairing farm equipment.

He kept careful records of his farming activities. He not only listed the dollar amounts in the ledgers, but also what it was for and the people that were involved in the transactions. Most of the people were from Hamlin and Parma. His banking was done in Brockport. Mr. Eidman gave a number of notes to pay expenses, most were due in the fall after the crops were harvested and sold.

He was also the collector for School District No. 11, the North Star School (History Center), for the period between 1896-1897. The first ledger contains his notes and entries as collector.

The last page of the ledger from 1887-1897, contains a "receipt for colds":

One oz. of prepared tar
½ lb. of strained honey
One pint of New England Rum
One tablespoon full three times a day. Oftener if necessary.

Ledgers, journals, photographs and diaries let us take a peek at the people from our past. If anybody has any of these items that deal with the Hamlin area and would like to share them, I would appreciate being able to make a copy for keeping at the History Center.
