The Craig A. Goodrich Dog Shelter, named for the driving force behind its creation, is a no-kill shelter where the staff diligently work to ensure the happiness of the dogs that they care for. Through a formalized application process, the effort is to ensure that adoptable dogs are appropriately matched to individual owners and families.

Dave Maynard, Hamlin's Dog Control Officer, and Caroline Thompson, the Assistant Dog Control Officer, work closely with shelter volunteers and other groups in the community to ensure the safety and sanitation of the shelter. They and the volunteers regularly interact with the dogs to ensure they remain well socialized and to better provide specific information about the dogs' personality to prospective owners. Earlier this year, a fenced play area was created where the dogs could also socialize with other dogs – critical for dogs who may be considered for a family who already has dogs.

Shelter staff also work with the community to ensure education and compliance with Town, County, and State animal control laws. For example, New York State Agriculture and Markets requires licensing all dogs 4 months and older; to license your dog you must show proof of valid rabies vaccine. All levels of government desire consistency in vaccination schedules to minimize the chance of a rabies outbreak. Licenses are renewed annually through the Town Clerk's Office. The Dog Control Officers also respond to 911 and other calls for assistance in the community such as at-large dogs, missing dogs, dog bites, and also provide information to the community about what to do when miscellaneous questions arise.

Please support the Town's efforts in effective dog management; it helps to ensure everyone's safety and makes for happier family companions!

With winter's arrival, so too comes the snowplows and salt to ensure everyone's safe passage through the Town. Please ensure that snow is not left in the road from your driveway, and do not pile it next to your mailbox because it makes it difficult for the plows to effectively clear the roadways. We apologize in advance for any mailboxes that are inadvertently hit by our plows. Should this occur, please contact the Highway Department at #964-2640 to report it and we will repair it as soon as possible. Know that plastic mailboxes do not hold up well in cold weather and are not advised.

After the holidays, Christmas trees may be brought to the Highway Department for recycling at 91 Railroad Avenue. You may pile your tree to the east of our fence by the brush pile. If you elect to put other brush in the pile, please observe the following requirements:

- * No lumber or landscape timbers
- * No manure or other refuse
- * Ensure the lights and bulbs have been removed from the tree you wish to recycle

BUILDING INSPECTOR/CODE COMPLIANCE OFFICE



After the New Year, many people start wishing for warmer weather! When the hot summer sun beats down, a swimming pool is very appealing. But because pools are attractive, they are potentially dangerous to young children. New York State building codes require pools to be fenced and gated and to be equipped with timers and alarms. If you are considering a swimming pool, hot tub, or spa purchase please contact the Hamlin Building Department first to obtain a permit and determine what requirements you must follow. The cost of the permit is \$25 and a final inspection is required before the pool can be used. An electrical inspection is necessary prior to the final inspection.



Failure to obtain a permit will result in a \$125 fine plus the cost of the permit.



Inground and above ground pools, including inflatable pools holding more than 24 inches of water, must be surrounded by a fence or other barrier at least 4' high. Any gates in the fence must be self-closing and self-latching. A timer for the motor is also required. If a home's wall serves as part of the swimming pools barrier, doors with direct access to the pool must be equipped with an alarm. These codes are in place for a reason. They are added safety measures to protect you, your neighbors, and your guests from swimming pool accidents. As a pool owner you are responsible for anyone in your pool. Other things to consider when installing a pool include zoning requirements, electrical clearances, and utility easements. The Hamlin Building Department also suggests contacting your insurance agent before installing a swimming pool. Most insurance companies require additional liability coverage. When opening an existing pool for the season, please remember that drainage procedures shall not interfere with the public water supply, existing drainage, sewage facilities, public highways, easements, or the property of others.

BUILDING PERMITS

A building permit is required in the Town of Hamlin for many things including a shed, fence, gazebo, pond, wood burning stove, emergency generator, and sign. Failure to obtain a Building Permit is subject to a \$125 fine plus the cost of the permit. If you have any questions about a permit or whether you need to get a permit, please contact the Building Department at #964-8181 Monday through Friday 9am-4pm.

HOUSE NUMBERS

To assist emergency crews in locating your house, please make sure that you have 5-inch numbers on your house that can be seen from the road, and reflective numbers on your mailbox. According to Hamlin Town Code, if your house is more than 75 feet back from the edge of the right-of-way, your house number should be displayed on a sign 25 feet from the road. If you have any questions, please call the Building Department at #964-8181.

BRUSH-GRASS-WEEDS

According to the Code of the Town of Hamlin, property owners are required to cut, trim, or remove brush, grass, rubbish, or weeds and to cut, trim, remove, or destroy poisonous shrubs and weeds on their property. Failure to comply with this code can result in a violation notice. If you have any questions, please contact the Building Department at #964-8181.

There is no charge to borrow equipment. However, we ask that the equipment is returned as soon as possible after use. All equipment goes out clean, sanitized, and in good repair. Good News!!!!

Starting in January 2015 you can stop in the Assessor's Office and inquire about **courtesy parcel merges**. There are certain conditions that need to be met in order for us to merge parcels:

- ❖ all parcels to be merged must be located in one town, one city, and in the same school district.
- ❖ all parcels must be contiguous.
- ❖ all parcels must be owned by the same person.
- ❖ the parcels cannot be in a subdivision.

Of note, if you decide to reverse your parcel merge, a subdivision map needs to be filed.

If the above conditions are met, the following must be submitted in order to begin processing the merger:

- ❖ proof that all Property Tax payments are up to date for each parcel included in the merge
- ❖ an original letter signed by all owners of the property requesting the courtesy merge of the properties

Courtesy combinations must be received in the Assessor's Office between January 1 and February 20, 2015. Please stop by the Assessor's office if you have any questions or inquiries about starting the process.

EXEMPTION DEADLINE!
The deadline for all NEW exemptions for the 2015 Tax Roll need to be in the Assessor's Office by March 1, 2015.



FIRE MARSHAL'S CORNER

A few reminders as we go into winter:

- ✓ Please do not plow or shovel snow into the roads or sidewalks. This can make it more difficult for emergency responders to get to your residence when assistance is needed.
- ✓ If you have a fire hydrant on your property, your assistance in keeping it clear of snow would be appreciated!
- ✓ Please ensure that your building/house numbers are visible from the street. Emergency responders depend on the house numbers to find the correct address. According to Hamlin Town Code, building numbers must be at least 5' high, in sharp contrast to the background color, must be on the side of the building that faces the road, and must be visible from the road.
- ✓ Use a metal pail when cleaning ashes from your fireplace or woodstove and place outside until cool.
- ✓ Make sure your wood-burning stove's chimney has been inspected and cleaned if needed.

Carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning is a danger when using fuel burning heating equipment, and occurs most often when equipment is not vented properly. CO is known as the "silent killer" because you cannot see it, smell it or taste it. At lower levels of exposure, CO causes mild effects that are often mistaken for the flu. These symptoms include headaches, dizziness, disorientation, nausea, and fatigue. The effects of CO exposure can vary greatly from person to person depending on age, overall health, and the concentration and length of exposure.

- ✓ Install a carbon monoxide alarm in a central location outside each sleeping area. CO alarms measure levels of the gas over time and are designed to sound an alarm before the average adult would experience symptoms.
- ✓ Every building with a carbon monoxide source (CO) should by law have a CO detector outside of each sleeping area. CO is produced by incomplete combustion of fossil fuels such as natural or propane gas, wood, kerosene, pellets, coal, corn, etc. If you do not yet have a CO detector, for the safety of both you and your family, please consider installing one soon.
- ✓ Do not run your portable generator in an area that would allow CO to build up in your home.



TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE



The Town Clerk is the oldest form of public servant in local government and was often the tax collector. The title "Clerk" developed from the latin word "clericus." During the Middle Ages, when scholarship and writing were often limited to the clergy, the term "clerk" came to mean a "scholar" because with their skills they could serve as notary, secretary, accountant, and recorder – skills that are still required of this position today. The term "Town Clerk" developed in the 1700's and continues to be used in jurisdictions throughout this country.

Did you know that.....

- * **Notary public services** are available at the Hamlin Town Clerk's office *at no charge?*
- * The Hamlin Town Clerk's office acts as an agent for the U.S. Government and accepts applications for U.S. Passports? We also take the pictures necessary for the application.
- * **Pistol permit applications** are available in the office?
- * The Hamlin Town Clerk's office sells New York State **Fishing and Hunting licenses** including big & small game, bow hunting, muzzleloading, turkey permits (spring & fall), etc. for both in-state and out-of-state residents....and that our *average process time is only 4.5 minutes per application?*
- * The Hamlin Town Clerk administers Oaths of Office to all Town elected officials, including the Fire Department?
- * The Town Clerk is responsible for maintenance of all records of **marriage licenses** issued in this Town? Records are available from 1900 to present day.

2015 TOWN & COUNTY TAXES

The Hamlin Town Clerk is the Tax Receiver and will again be in the process of receiving/accounting for Town and County taxes. Town/County Tax bills will be sent to non-escrowed Town residents approximately 12/31/2014. No interest is added to bills that are paid in full by 2/10/15. You may elect to pay your Town/County Tax bill in installments. If you did not pay your 2014 School Taxes in full, the residual amount will be rolled over and added to your Town/County Tax bill.

Effective 1/5/15 through 2/8/15, the office will be open until 6pm on Monday evenings only for those individuals wishing to pay their Town/County Tax bill but who can not come during regular business hours. You may also elect to mail your tax payment to the office; please ensure that you allow sufficient time for the bill to be receipted!

If you have recently paid off your mortgage and should now be receiving your tax bill directly, or if you have moved, please call the Town Clerk's Office @ 964-2421 and advise the Tax Receiver.

Do not drop off your child prior to designated class time and be prompt in picking up your child at the end of the program. For your child's safety, please come into the program location to drop off and pick up your child.


