

Hamlin Town Board Meeting December 12, 2011

The Hamlin Town Board held their regular scheduled meeting in the Hamlin Town Hall located at 1658 Lake Road, Hamlin, New York. The meeting was called to order at 7 pm by Supervisor Terry. The locations of the fire exits and defibrillator were explained for those present. Everyone was invited to participate in the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence for the deceased residents of Hamlin.

Present: Councilperson Thomas Breslawski, Councilperson Craig Goodrich, Councilperson Paul S. Rath, Councilperson David Rose, and Supervisor Peter Terry. Also present: Attorney Ken Licht; Highway Superintendent Steven Baase; Building Inspector Lee Nettin; Conservation Board Members Jason Baxter; Ed Evans; and Nick Kramer; Planning Board Member Mark Reeves; Town Historian Bob Kruger; Library Director Kay Hughes Dennett; and Library Trustee Bonnie Beardsley.

PUBLIC FORUM

Supervisor Terry reminded all those present of the rules of Public Forum and opened the Public Forum.

Mark Reeves, 3640 Brick Schoolhouse Road – This is regarding the CCC Camp letter published December 11th in the Hamlin Herald. I would like to respond.

Let's title it: "No good deed goes unpunished", a modern spin on an old saying.

The "Mayor of Moscow Road" in his letter invents an "insult to the legacy of the men and women of the CCC". The CCC was formed during the Great Depression to provide work relief employment to young, unmarried men. The majority of funds earned by the young men were sent home to Mom and Dad while it provided a ready unskilled manual workforce tasked to the development and conservation of natural resources on government lands in rural areas (ref. WIKI). In our area the creation of parks is the most visible of their work. And how did they do it? Back then America was a nation of builders and people of action. Public works projects were to benefit all the folks, not cater to the wishes of one or two. No way could a park be created today like Hamlin Beach. There were no environmental impact statements, open comment periods, soil sampling, fauna classification, numerous studies and committee reviews and public comment. No waiting for years while the complainers fought the project in the courts, and no "Socialists" complaining to the media, making signs, creating tons of garbage or living in filth like the OWS crowd.

Here is what the CCC did to build parks in our region:

- *Cleared land by cutting down trees and hedgerows.*
- *Leveled hills, filled in marshes and swampland.*
- *Rerouted streams and installed stone stream banks.*
- *Dammed streams while building bridges and roads.*
- *Built quarries for mining masonry and road materials.*
- *Stripped stream beds and lake shores for building stone.*
- *Leveled land and installed parking lots.*
- *When they were done, they planted mono-culture tracks of trees now maligned by "environmentalists".*

And all was done in areas which are now considered "environmentally sensitive". Was the Environment affected? Yes, but temporarily – look at what it is now. Monuments, created by the best of us, enjoyed by thousands, is the CCC legacy with Hamlin Beach as one of the finest examples.

The Mayor would like you to believe that the Hamlin CCC site was under this pristine forest canopy where the wild animals played and man was able to roam freely without hindrance. The truth is it was mostly like trying to walk through steel wool, made up of willows, vines, thorns and poison ivy. If anything, we have neglected the park. He suggests that the animals were driven away somehow by the site restoration with no data to support the statement. Maybe it “defies logic” that perhaps they just walked to another part of the hundreds of acres in the park.

*Through Mr. Evan’s efforts, we have the opportunity to celebrate the memory of the workers in the CCC and later to the people of Hamlin supporting the WWII Prisoner of War Camp in their town. Mr. Evan’s doesn’t sit on the sidelines making self serving and diminutive argument. Whether it is the Yantee Creek/Shoreline Project, Energy conservation and wind or the CCC / POW Camp – he goes all in. He is also one of the best among us. Let us support Mr. Evans and his efforts and speak out for the camp restoration and its historical place in 20th century America. Restoring the camp outlines, the parade site with flagpole and maybe a full size barrack will show our citizens what can be accomplished by a united people, hard work and few government regulations to hold them back. **That** is the lesson to teach today.*

The real reason for the Mayor’s letter? The camp is across the street from his house. Don’t let the petty and small have the final say.

DISCUSSION:

- Newsletter* – Due to most of the Town Hall information posted in the newsletter being repetitive, it was suggested that the newsletter be used for Recreation only. If anything important came up, Recreation would allow room to place articles as needed. It was suggested that the name be changed. It was also decided that it wasn't a Town Board issue and the decisions could be made by Recreation and the Town Clerk.

2. ***Dog Control Van*** – Steve provided a 3rd quote for fixing the van. Councilperson Rose stated that he didn't think any more money should be put into the van because it wasn't worth that much. He suggested taking the Highway Foreman's pickup truck that is being replaced and putting a cap on it. Councilperson Goodrich asked what it would be worth at auction. Councilperson Breslawski suggested that this could be an opportunity to look into consolidating with another town. Councilperson Rath stated that the \$1,400 repair would get them through at least one more year and during that time they could look at potentially consolidating that service or a longer term solution to that vehicle and budget appropriately.

Councilperson Breslawski reported on the following:

- The Recreation Office is under construction and is almost complete.
- The Library is continuing lease negotiations; their lease expires on December 31st.
- I would like to thank Peter Terry for two years as Town Supervisor; he has done a nice job. I appreciate your help in transitioning the office and I wish you the best in your retirement.
- I appreciate Paul Rath's 15 years of service on the Town Board and all that you have helped me with. I wish you the best as Town Justice.
- Paul's dad is retiring at the end of the year after 34+ years of service as Town Justice.

Councilperson Goodrich reported on the following:

- Hamlin Volunteer Ambulance had their meeting and gave their financial report. They talked about a person being removed and not attending. They have a new insurance form they are working on.
- Dog Control Officer had 13 calls and is working on getting the licenses up-to-date.
- For the Zoning Board Judy Hazen is going in for a Public Hearing, and they are reserving decision for Lorraine Vyverberg as a study of the comments are being made.

Councilperson Rose reported on the following:

- Senior Citizens are having their annual Christmas Party at the Hometown Café tomorrow; 127 people have signed up to attend.
- I would like to start up the Zoning Workshop here on January 12th at 7 pm.
- I would like to wish everyone a merry Christmas.
- Paul, I wish you luck in your new adventure.
- Peter, it has been nice working with you.

Highway Superintendent Steven Baase reported on the following:

- The snow fence stakes are going up now.
- The Grain Communication Tower footer is in.
- The trucks are all ready for snow. The salt is there, and the sand is all mixed.
- I'm talking to Greece and hopefully the brush will be chipped soon.

Building Inspector Lee Nettin reported on the following:

- They have started the new Grain Communications Tower. We have encountered a few problems, which we have resolved as we went along. They are not putting the steel up until spring.

Library Director Kay Hughes-Dennett reported on the following:

- We are quiet this time of year. People aren't reading; they are Christmas shopping.
- We are ready to start a new program in January called "Tuesdays at 2." It's a book club.

Conservation Board Jason Baxter reported on the following:

- Last month we had one referral for a 16 x 20 barn down on Shore Acres with a 6' fence. Merritt went down to take a look at it and said the barn had already been started without a permit, so Lee has been on top of that. It's about 9' from the property line. Originally they were talking about moving it, but now they are going to leave it there and go for a variance but a DEC permit is also required because it is close to the lot lines.
- Friends Meeting for the Hamlin Beach State Park is December 14 at 7 pm.

Town Historian Bob Kruger reported on the following:

- I was invited to talk to the Senior Citizens on March 27th.
- I would like to wish everyone a happy holiday.

Councilperson Rath reported on the following:

- I would like to submit my letter of resignation, effective December 31, 2011.
- I want to thank the Board, the Republican Committee and the residents for their support since I took office in 1996. I have served with four different supervisors and eight different council persons. Numerous resolutions of appreciation and numerous support board members were appointed in addition to several miles of water lines were established and all four of my children were born during my tenure on the Board
- Read a summary of Town Board meetings during his service to the Town. (See Below)

Summary of Town Board meetings during my service to the Town:

Sept 9, 1996 – 1st Board meeting, sworn in by my father.

October 1996 – First law was the Noise Ordinance

1997 – Involved with a committee that was looking to expand the school at Brockport. Hamlin was one of the final four due to our involvement and the fact that 50% of the students were coming from north of 104, but they decided to put the building on the campus.

February 1997 – TOPS supermarkets opened.

February 1997 – Resolution to deny rezoning of parcel behind TOPS to route 18 to allow for senior housing. I was for the rezoning due to location and a vision for the future, but others were afraid of the high density sprawl that could occur. 7 years later, this parcel was brought before the board again finally rezoned for senior housing and is currently being developed.

May 1997 – Town Park security was established to protect and monitor our parks

June 1997 – First Free Fishing Day was held

December 1997 – Town Sprinkler Law passed

May 1998 – TB passed a resolution in support to pursue a Town Library

June 1998 – The First Hamlin Wheel Fest event was held

2007 and 2008 – I was heavily involved in getting a community center proposal before the voters of Hamlin by various meetings, cost analysis, tours and establishing and working with the committee.

September 1998 – Resolution for the referendum of the construction of a Community Center for a total cost of \$1,500,000 to be placed on the ballot in November 2008.

November 1998 – Referendum was voted down. 2,868 entered the voting booth, but only 1922 voted. The result was 1,064 to 858, a difference of 206. However, 946 voters did not vote. How potentially different our Town could have been if those 946 voters had voted on the referendum.

1999 – Councilperson Hollink was able to get 5 wooden Welcome to Hamlin signs constructed

January 1999 – Resolution passed titled “Expectations of Support Board Members”

November 1999 – Budget was established for the Hamlin’s first library.

November 1999 – Dr. Lang was before the Board to rezone the property, where his current building is, so he could build his office and keep his business in Town.

December 1999 – Recreation Master plan was updated and approved.

February 2000 – The Extra Mile Award was established for residents or groups within the Town who have displayed an act of kindness or going that “extra mile”

March 2000 – An updated employee manual was approved with several changes.

June 2000 – The Town sponsored a “kick off the summer” picnic at the Town Hall. IT was well attended and made the news.

October 2000 – Passed a resolution naming Ed Evans as the official photographer of the Town

November 2000 – Town accepted title to 2806 Roosevelt Hwy. This is the secondary entrance to the Park and recreation fields and the road where the Charlie Maier Lodge is located.

December 2000 – The first All Boards meeting was held. Do not remember why this was not continued, but could be revisited in the future.

December 2000 – Approved contract with ESL to have an ATM located outside the Town Hall

December 2000 – Town of Hamlin website was established

December 2000 – Plans and discussions to renovate the existing recreation building into the new court building were started.

August 2001 – A Town of Hamlin Mission Statement was adopted.

September 2001 – Groundbreaking on the Court House

August 2002 – Resolution to send to auction a 1943 and 1946 Walters Trucks with snow plow equipment. We tend to get the most out of our equipment.

July 2002 - Town rezoned a parcel for Pavilion State Bank at their request. The Bank never proceeded to build.

October 2002 – We actually passed a resolution to restrict anyone from going behind the counter of the Town Clerk’s counter with the exception of employees.

December 2002 – Adopted Wireless Telecommunications Facility Siting Law

February 2003 – After 5+ years of work and waiting on the State a draft LWRP was approved pending final state approval.

August 27, 2003 – Proclamation of Hamlin Heritage Day in recognition of 150 years since the establishment of the Town

October 2004 – Senior zoning approved

October 2004 – Estate of Margaret McGrath leave \$200,000 to the Town towards the library

May 2005 – Hamlin joined the Monroe County Municipal Workers Compensation Plan. This is a self insured plan which has resulted in lower premiums and savings to the Town as a direct result of our employees acting safely and not getting injured on the job.

June 2005 – Update Open Space Index was adopted.

July 2005 – Our Board meeting contained 8 public hearings on amendments to local laws.

October 2005 – LWRP was once again approved by the Town Board with minimal changes as requested by NYS which took over two years to review. This process was going on for over 7 years at this point.

February 2006 – Start of Potential Wind Tower discussions

April 2006 – Resolution passed to lease our water lines over to the Monroe County Water Authority under the terms of a 40 year agreement with MCWA providing \$850,000 in assistance for future water line development in Hamlin.

June 2006 – The first full time Building Inspector/ Code enforcement office was appointed.

January 2007 – The updated Town of Hamlin Comprehensive Master Plan was adopted.

July 2007 – Resolution support non-attorney town justices was passed.

November 2007 – Established Child Safety Zones in the Town

December 2007 – Established Curfew Law

August 2008 – Approval to return the Town to full market value by conducting a reevaluation at a cost of in excess of \$300,000 without raising taxes. This was funded through prior reserves and the special projects fund.

May 2010 – Finally received the letter from NYS accepting the LWRP. It took the state over 7 years to review and approve.

June 2010 – New Charlie Maier Lodge building is completed.

June 2010 – 10th anniversary of our Town Library was celebrated.

September 2010 – The fire departments were awarded a grant to look into consolidation.

RESIGNATION OF COUNCILMAN PAUL RATH ACCEPTED

Resolution # 234 Motion was made by Councilperson Rose, seconded by Councilperson Breslawski, requesting Town Board resolution to accept the resignation of Councilman Paul Rath effective December 31, 2011.
