Resolution # 148 – Motion was made by Councilperson Goodrich, seconded by Councilperson Rose to declare Local Law #1-2012 - revising side setback requirements for private garages and carports in the SR (Shoreline Residential) Zoning District a Type 2 Unlisted Action for the purposes of SEQR.

APPROVING LOCAL LAW #1-2012

Resolution # 149 – Motion was made by Councilpersons Goodrich and Rose, seconded by Councilperson Baxter approving a local law revising side setback requirements for private garages and carports in the SR (Shoreline Residential) Zoning District, as follows:

Section 1: Subparagraph (B) (2) (a) of Section 520-21 of the Town of Hamlin Zoning Law of 1991, entitled “SR District (Shoreline Residential)” is hereby deleted and replaced by the following:

- (a) Detached private garages and carports, subject to the restrictions in §520-27, except that the side setback requirement set forth in §520-27(C) shall not be applicable. The side setback for detached private garages and carports shall be determined pursuant to subparagraph 520-21(C) (2) (b).

Resolution # 150 – Motion was made by Councilperson Goodrich, seconded by Councilperson Baxter to declare a local law to add “roadside stands” as a permitted accessory use in the R-M (Residential/Medium Density) Zoning District a Type 2 Unlisted Action for the purposes of SEQR.

APPROVING LOCAL LAW # 2-2012

Resolution # 151 – Motion was made by Councilperson Rose, seconded by Councilperson Goodrich approving Local Law # 2-2012 to add “roadside stands” as a permitted accessory use in the R-M (Residential/Medium Density) Zoning District, as follows:

Section 1: Section 520-14 of the Town of Hamlin Zoning Law of 1991, entitled “R-M District (Residential/Medium Density)” is hereby amended to add a subparagraph designated (m) to subparagraph A (4) entitled “Accessory Structures/Uses”:

520-14(A) (4) (m) Temporary or permanent roadside stands, subject to the restrictions in § 520-32.

SEQR FOR LOCAL LAW #3-2012

Resolution # 152 – Motion was made by Councilperson Goodrich, seconded by Councilperson Baxter to declare a local law revising regulations for pergolas and sheds a Type 2 Unlisted Action for the purposes of SEQR.

APPROVING LOCAL LAW #3-2012

Resolution # 153- Motion was made by Councilperson Goodrich, seconded by Councilperson Rose approving a Local Law #3-2012 -revising regulations for pergolas and sheds, as follows:

Section 1. Section 520-30 of the Town of Hamlin Zoning Law of 1991 entitled “Porches”, is modified to have the title “Porches, Decks and Pergolas” and to provide as follows:

520-30. Porches, Decks and Pergolas.

Non-enclosed porch structures, decks and pergolas, covered or open air, not exceeding a distance of 10 feet forward of the front foundation of the residence, are allowable, even when such structure encroaches within the required setback area. A building permit, granted at the discretion of the Building Department, shall be required prior to the construction, movement or replacement of any porch, deck or pergola permitted in this section. At its discretion, the Building Department may defer decision to the Zoning Board of Appeals, which may provide direction on these matters without necessarily holding a public hearing.

Section 2. Section 520-31 of the Town of Hamlin Zoning Law of 1991, entitled “Sheds and Similar Structures” is hereby revised to exclude all references to pergolas and to provide that the maximum height of structures permitted pursuant to the section is eight feet. The revised section provides as follows:

520-31. Sheds and Similar Structures.

Sheds, cabanas and similar or other accessory structures are permitted, provided that such structures are incidental to the principal or primary residential use on the property and subject to the following restrictions: A building permit shall be required prior to the construction, movement or replacement of any shed, cabana or other accessory structure permitted in this section.

- A. Any shed, cabana or similar accessory structure shall not exceed 256 square feet in area, no one side shall exceed 16 feet in length, and all walls shall have a maximum height of eight feet. One of each type of structure shall be permitted per lot except for R-L District (two) and R-VL District (three) as determined by the Building Inspector.
- B. A shed, cabana or similar accessory structure must be erected behind the front main foundation line of the principal dwelling on any lot and 10 feet from any building used for residential purposes. A side and rear setback of no less than 5 feet may be maintained as long as there is the 10 foot separation from any structures on neighboring properties.
- C. If erected on a corner lot, a shed, cabana or similar accessory structure must be located behind the rear and street side main foundation lines of the principal dwelling or building on the lot. On through lots, structures shall not be located nearer than 30 feet to either street line. A shed, cabana or similar accessory structure may not be erected on a vacant lot, unless such lot is owned by an adjacent property owner and such shed, cabana or similar accessory structure is for his/her exclusive use.
- D. A shed, cabana or similar accessory structure may not be used to park or store automobiles, trucks, vans or other similar motor vehicles, nor may such structures be used to provide living space of any kind.

- E. Playhouses less than 64 square feet and with a wall height less than 6 feet and intended for use by children shall not require a building permit, nor will swing sets, play sets and similar recreational structures intended for private residential use of children, provided they are constructed on residential parcels and conform to setback requirements.

- F. Any arbor-like structure with dimensions which do not exceed 4 feet in width by 4 feet in length, or a total of 16 square feet, shall not require a building permit.

APPROVING LOCAL LAW #4-2012

Resolution # 155 – Motion was made by Councilperson Baxter, seconded by Councilperson Goodrich approving Local Law #4-2012 -to redefine the term “Height of Structure.”, as follows:

Section 1: Section 520-9 of the Town of Hamlin Zoning Law of 1991, entitled “Word Usage and Definitions” is hereby modified to change the definition of the term “Height of Structure” as follows:

Height of Structure: The vertical distance from the average grade, as measured three feet from the foundation, to the average height of the highest roof surface.

SEQR FOR LOCAL LAW #5-2012

Resolution # 156 – Motion was made by Councilperson Goodrich, seconded by Councilperson Baxter to declare a local law to redefine the term “Subdivision” and to exclude lot combinations from the procedural requirements for approval of subdivision a Type 2 Unlisted Action for the purposes of SEQR.

Polled Votes: Councilperson Baxter aye, Councilperson Goodrich aye, Councilperson Rose aye, Supervisor Breslawski aye. Motion carried.

APPROVING LOCAL LAW #5-2012

Resolution # 157 – Motion was made by Councilperson Baxter, seconded by Councilperson Goodrich approving Local Law #5-2012 -to redefine the term “Subdivision” and to exclude lot combinations from the procedural requirements for approval of subdivision, as follows:

Section 1: Section 520-9 of the Town of Hamlin Zoning Law of 1991 is hereby amended to substitute the following for the definition of the term “subdivision”.

Subdivision. The division of a parcel of land into two or more lots, blocks or sites, with or without streets or highways, described by the metes and bounds and a reference map or survey of the property or by any other methods of description for the purpose of sale, lease, license or any other reason. The term includes resubdivision and, when appropriate to the context, shall relate to the process of subdividing or to the land subdivided. To qualify as a conforming subdivision, the subdivision must be approved by the Town Planning Board and other appropriate government agencies and recorded with the Monroe County Clerk’s Office. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the creation of a lot that is created simply by combining two or more contiguous lots, and any plat consisting solely of alteration of lot lines in which there is no increase in the non-conformity of the area requirements or setback requirements of any resulting lot, does not constitute a “subdivision”, but shall be subject to review and approval by the Planning Board.

Section 2: Subparagraph J of Section 520-66 of the Town of Hamlin Zoning Law of 1991 (“Plats”) is hereby replaced in its entirety by the following:

520-66 “Plats”.

J. WAIVER OF REQUIREMENTS.

1. Alteration of Lot Lines. The Planning Board shall review all plats which consist solely of alteration of lot lines between two or more contiguous lots. Upon a determination that there is no increase in the non-conformity of any dimensional area or setback requirements to any resulting lot, the Planning Board shall approve the plat and the procedures for approval of subdivision plats do not apply. In the event there is any increase in the non-conformity of any dimensional area or setback requirement to any resulting lot, the procedures for approval of subdivision plats apply subject to the discretion of the Planning Board to waive any of the procedures for approval of subdivision plats, including any requirement

for a public hearing. The Planning Board shall not, however, approve any such plat in which there is an increase in the non-conformity of any dimensional area or setback requirement of any lot unless the Zoning Board of Appeals has issued a variance.

2. Lot Combinations. An application for a plat that simply combines two or more contiguous lots must be reviewed by the Planning Board and such plat shall be approved upon the Planning Board's determination that the plat meets requirements for filing as determined by that Board. Such plats are not considered as subdivisions.

TRAINING SESSION APPROVED

Resolution # 158 – Motion was made by Councilperson Rose, seconded by Councilperson Goodrich authorizing a training session on May 7, 2012 from 6 PM until 7 PM, conducted by the Town Engineer and Attorney to the Town, on the new local law redefining the term “Subdivision” to count as one hour of continuing education for Support Board members, as required by New York State.

HIRING OF J. O'CONNELL AND ASSOCIATES FOR LIBRARY GRANTS

RESOLUTION # 159 – Motion was made by Councilperson Baxter, seconded by Councilperson Rose giving authorization to expend no more than \$3,000.00 from the Library Special Projects account for the purpose of hiring J O'Connell and Associates to write a New York State Library Construction Grant for the Town of Hamlin.

Polled Votes: Councilperson Baxter aye, Councilperson Goodrich aye, Councilperson Rose aye, Supervisor Breslawski aye. Motion carried.

DISCUSSION

1. Grant Writers- Supervisor Breslawski asked the board if they would be interested in looking into a Grant writer. He stated that the Town of Clarkson uses “J. O'Connell and Associates as the Library does now. Their cost is \$5,000.00 to do research for grants and \$20,000.00 a year to hire them.

Councilperson Rose suggested that if we are going to do that, maybe we should ask the different department heads if there are grants they would like to have them do, before we commit to this.

Supervisor Breslawski will put an e-mail out to the department heads for their input.

REPORTS

Councilperson Baxter reported the following:

- Library – Is contracting with J. O’Connell and Associates for grants and they also have had a few contractors in to talk about the cost on items when they start to build. The card count is the same as last year; they have a few thing scheduled like, Munchkin Monday, Craft Saturdays, Knit/Crochet Group and making cards.
- Recreation – They would like a couple of sign put up for the dogs that are running off leashes and the profanity. Highway Superintendent Baase stated that those signs are already up all over the part.
- Earth Day is April 21st from 9am – 3pm and is being held at the Hamlin Beach State Park, area 3.
- I Love My Park Day is May 5th from 9am-1pm.

Councilperson Goodrich reported on the following:

- Hilton Parma Fire district had 87 calls last month and is having a problem with getting warranty work done.
- Hamlin Volunteer Ambulance has had 143 calls this year and still having problems getting people to volunteer.
- The Dog Warden has had 26 calls this past month.

Councilperson Rose reported on the following:

- Planning Board had a short agenda.
- Seniors Executive Committee meets tomorrow.
- I attended the Hamlin Fireman’s Banquet.

Highway Superintendent Steven Baase reported on the following:

- Brush pick up is April 23-27 and Junk Drop off is April 21-29.
- Newsletter – trying to get the Sun king logo on the front page so that the residents know we are doing the free recycling for electrics.
- Tower is up and running.
- We are doing some ditching and road patching.
- The State will be doing milling on RT. 19 and 260 from Roosevelt Highway to the Parkway.
- Army Corp of Engineers was down on Brick Schoolhouse today for a couple of hours, don’t know what the outcome is, they told me they would send me a report.

CEO Lee Nettin reported on the following:

- The EOC program that was only going to be 10 minutes is now a 3 hour training class.
- We have had a higher than usually amount of complaints coming in.

Assessor Donald Wells reported on the following:

- We are about a week behind with the notices going out.
- Marsha is coming in 3 days a week for a couple of hours.

Library director Kay Hughes-Dennett reported on the following:

- We had another picture in the D & C, the interest is very positive.
- She is very excited is watch everything playing out and coming together.

Historian Robert Kruger reported on the following:

- Mr. Kruger was not at the meeting but sent his report in earlier as follows
- The last three weeks in March were busy ones. We had more phone calls and visitors than in the months of February and January.
- I still keep writing articles for the “Democrat and Chronicle”. I’ve had many nice comments about them.
- During the third week in March, with the warm weather I was able to paint the new Mail Wagon shed. I would like to thank Denny Roach for his help on this project. Two brushes are certainly faster than one.
- Some outdoor clean up was also accomplished with dead flowers pulled out and limbs picked up. Even a few windows got washed.
- On March 27th, I spoke to about 70 senior citizens at St. John Church about the history of Hamlin, talking about and reading four articles from the “Memories” column of the “Our Town” section of the paper. It seemed to be well received.
- Final preparations are being done for the schoolhouse program that will be held in cooperation with the Recreation Department on Friday, April 13th at the History Center.

Supervisor Breslawski reported on the following:

- When reviewing the monthly utility prepaid bills, I noticed that our current rate for Burnwell propane (for the History Center) is \$2.449 per gallon. My rate at home is \$2.199. I called Burnwell, spoke to a sales manager and they agreed to match the rate of \$2.199. Last month we used 199.4 gallons. At the old rate that is \$488.33, at our new rate it is \$438.48. That is a savings of \$49.85. Contract prices typically come out in August to September, so I will be keeping an eye out to negotiate the best possible rate for next year.
- We received an award from our insurance company, which Supervisor Breslawski presented to Highway Superintendent Steve Baase for his efforts with the Highway crew.
- Last month I received the unfortunate news that RCAP Solutions, the Community Development firm that was preparing our grant application for a possible lakeshore sewer district, is downsizing. The person responsible for our application has been let go, but did pass on information that Hamlin’s application was almost completed at the time of his departure from the company. He left contact information for the company, but despite numerous emails and telephone messages, I have yet to receive a reply. I plan to send a hard copy letter this week in an attempt to salvage what’s left of our grant application.
- I met with residents of the Brick Schoolhouse Road and Rose Circle neighborhood, our Code Enforcement Officer Lee Nettin, and Monroe County Sheriff Crime Prevention Deputy Joseph Resch on March 29th to discuss some noise, junk vehicle and reckless ATV operation complaints that are being made in

the area. It was a productive meeting and allowed me the chance to pass along several of our local codes, including the Town of Hamlin Curfew Law, to the Sheriff's Department. They are making hard copies of these codes and placing them in all patrol cars that serve the Town of Hamlin. The Sheriff will also be sending an ATV patrol unit out to help control some of the ATV problems in town.

- I have been in touch with Linda Rabjohn of the Ethics Board and asked her to put together the yearly Organizational Meeting for the Ethics Board. Linda agreed to the task and will be holding that meeting, per the Town Code on Ethics, in the Supervisors Office on April 17th.
- Last month I received a notice from the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation that our Benedict Beach Water District Easement had expired on March 27, 2007. It is the Office's new policy to grant Permanent Easements for municipal utility crossings of Park or Parkway lands. Our responsibility as a Town is to provide the easement map and the legal description. JP has prepared this and I am forwarding it to the State. When completed and approved, it will be returned to the Town for our approval and then filed with Monroe County.
- Over the weekend of March 30th-April 1st, there were several complaints about the bright white flashing strobe light on the new tower. I called Dick Comi at CMS on Monday and he quickly got to the bottom of it. The FAA requires the light to be 20,000 candle power of white light during the day, but they are allowed to turn down to 2,000 candle power of red light during the night. Our light was not functioning correctly, which caused the terrible, lightning like strobe effect that the town had been experiencing. The power was turned on at the site the last week in March, however it wasn't scheduled to be turned on until Monday April 2nd, so Grain Communications did not even know that the light was on and functioning. The dimmer sensor was not working, but they were able to turn the light down from a remote location, so we should not be experiencing any more problems. The light will be white during the day and red at night from now on.
- Lastly, on March 27th, I met with the Fire District Consolidation Committee and the Supervisors of Kendall and Clarkson. The Committee has a firm target date for consolidation of March 1, 2013. They are in the process of interviewing interested candidates for the Fire Commissioner positions and will be presenting a slate to the Town Boards of all three towns for a joint approval. The Committee has requested that the Town Boards come together and meet on March 4, 2013 to place the new Commissioners.\

Highway Superintendent Steven Baase also reported that his men were working around the building this afternoon and notices that the building across the road was on fire (Accent Woodworks) and they called 911 and grabbed the fire extinguishers and put the fire out before the Fire Department came.

The names of the employees are Andy Engelbert, Ron E. Rodas and Mike German.

ADJOURN TO EXECUTIVE SESSION

Resolution # 160 – Motion was made by Councilperson Baxter, seconded by Councilperson Rose to adjourn to Executive Session at 7:45 PM to discuss acquisition of particular real property where publicity would substantially affect the value, and a matter relating to an appointment of a particular person including financial and employment history.
